Got something to say? Be a part of Oxfordshire Voice

NHS Oxfordshire is calling on people in the county who have something to say about their community to become part of Oxfordshire Voice.

Have you ever commented on a story on a newspaper or radio website? Do you want the opportunity to regularly comment where it can make a real difference to your area? If you answered yes to these questions then you might be interested in Oxfordshire Voice.

Oxfordshire Voice is a citizen's panel made up of Oxfordshire residents who have volunteered to give up some of their time to answer four questionnaires a year created in partnership between NHS Oxfordshire and Oxfordshire County Council.

The panel is carefully recruited to be representative of the population of Oxfordshire but there are some areas where we need to recruit more people.

You can have your say on line or by post – whichever you prefer. You could be invited to take part in other activities like online discussion forums or group discussions if this is something you are interested in.

Previous topics the panel have answered questions on include: where people think the council and NHS should save money and what the priorities should be, alcohol and drinking patterns, whether the police and other public services are successfully dealing with crime and anti-social behaviour and people's experiences of local health services and transport issues.

What the panel says is used by the Council and NHS to help develop services and change the way things are done. For example, one set of results asked for more support for pregnant women as a result NHS Oxfordshire developed a service for new mums just out of hospital with their babies, to provide breastfeeding support. Getting people into running

Go Active in South Oxfordshire, along with Thame Town Council, is launching the first Run in England 3-2-1 programme in the county.

Run in England 3-2-1 is an England Athletics' initiative designed to get people across the country into running and has been granted the Inspire Mark, the badge of the London 2012 Inspire Programme.

As the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games inspire people to get active Run in England 3-2-1 brings accessible and beginner friendly running routes across the country. Signposted routes with markers at three, two and one miles give people the opportunity to challenge themselves and build their fitness as they look to progress the speed at which they walk, jog or run.

In partnership with Run in England, GO Active set up more than 12 social running groups across South Oxfordshire and wants to involve even more people by setting up the 3-2-1 routes locally.

The 3-2-1 routes in Thame will start from Thame Leisure Centre and will officially be opened on Saturday, 6 November, 10am by Thame Mayor, Adam Buckland and local running group Running Buddies.


