TETSWORTH MEMORIAL HALL: RENOVATED AND READY FOR YOU!

The final build and renovation of Tetsworth Memorial Hall concluded in July 2013, with an attractive Oxfordshire -style barn taking the place of the old and unlovely breeze-block building.

David Parker Architects and GDS Builders worked in partnership with the Memorial Hall Build Committee to ensure the new building met the needs of everyone within the Village community.

The renovation programme was funded through a combination of grants from Tetsworth Parish Council, SODC, and the EU LEADER fund, plus donations and Village Hall fundraising activities.

The light, bright and airy main Hall offers space for up to 120 people with a new meeting room suitable for up to 25 people, secure storage and office space on the first floor, new toilets and off-street parking.

Garden landscaping is underway. The Committee are hard at work fundraising for the Phase II activities: a new kitchen facility and WIFI.

Rural Community Energy Fund is launched

The Rural Community Energy Fund for England was launched on Friday 28 June. This £15 million government fund will help rural communities with the cost of getting renewable energy projects up and running.

Having originally proposed the scheme to government, the Centre for Sustainable Energy (CSE) has been closely involved in its development and design with Defra and DECC. They are confident that it offers a more sustainable and practical support mechanism for community-led energy projects than many previous government support schemes.

It's also the first time a support scheme has focused specifically on supporting communities to establish larger renewable energy projects.

The Department of Energy and Climate Change say: "The Rural Community Energy Fund is specifically targeted at helping rural communities access the money needed to carry out feasibility studies into renewable energy projects, and fund the costs associated with applying for planning permission. It is intended that projects will then be able to attract private finance to pay for renewable energy kit and get projects up and running.

"Funding can be used to support rural projects across the renewable and low carbon energy spectrum including wind, solar, biomass, heat pumps, anaerobic digestion, gas combined heat and power and hydro."

The Christmas gift fair will be held on the 30th November at 10am till 2pm. Coffee, tea and cakes served through out the day with lunch available from 12pm.





Tetsworth Village – future perfect!

On Saturday 14th September the dual event of the annual produce and craft show and the launch of the next Parish Plan gave villagers the first opportunity to experience the scope and space available in the refurbished Memorial Hall.

The small conference room buzzed as people came to think about their vision for Tetsworth over the next 10 years. People were asked what facilities in the village were important to them, how Tetsworth might be improved and the best and worst aspects of the village. Plans for a possible development at Mount Farm were displayed with an aim to gauge the feelings in the village towards plans for possible growth.

The M40 group have done sterling work, over a number of years, researching, lobbying and pestering those in authority, for them to understand the impact of noise from the motorway for those living along its borders. As a consequence of professional pressure from the group the highways authority have at last agreed to use the M40 section from Junctions 6 - 8 as the UK pilot to demonstrate the affect of the latest in barrier design and construction in conjunction with solar energy collection panels. Installation should be happening on our part of the motorway in the next 12 months.

The Memorial Hall refurbishment and the M40 motorway group are just two excellent examples of the value of determination and people power to make a difference.

The launch of a new plan for Tetsworth is only the beginning. It has been shown already that working together can count. Hare coursing

The Hunting Act 2004 made hare coursing illegal! Hare coursing tends to start after harvest, around the end of August or start of September when large tracts of land are left without standing crops. Coursing is more likely to take place at dawn or dusk.

The most obvious sign is a group of vehicles parked in a rural area, perhaps by a gateway to farmland, on a grass verge, on a farm track or bridle path. There will usually be estate cars, four wheel drives or vans. They may contain evidence of dogs inside such as muddy paw prints and dog hair.

Hare coursers often travel in convoy with vans at the front and rear containing minders Operations are carried out across the force to deal with this issue. For example 'Operation Animal' in Aylesbury Vale or Operation Oust in West Berkshire.
